Fresno County officials hosted a community meeting on Thursday, October 1, at Sierra High's Frantz Stadium to share information with residents affected by the Creek Fire. A succession of elected officials and agency representatives addressed a variety of issues, after which questions were taken from the audience.

District 5 Supervisor Nathan Magsig, who facilitated the meeting, remarked, "Communication has been challenging at times [but we] want to make sure it never breaks down."

Highlights of the presentations include the following. Jolie Browar of Behavioral

Health praised the resiliency of the community, asking people to continue to look out for each other and watch for markers of trauma, such as excessive irritability.

Sheriff Margaret Mims credited the work that Cal Fire, SCE and the Highway 168 Fire Safe Council have done over the years for getting everyone out with no loss of life. As evacuees repopulate, "let us know if you've been the victim of

A Landmark Survives

"This fire does not dictate who we are," Big Creek School principal Toby Wait stated emphatically. "It's going to be a long, heavy lift, but we're going to rise to that challenge—because there is no alternative." He speaks not only for himself and his family, but for his school and his community.

Early unconfirmed reports during the Creek Fire were that the town of Big Creek was completely gone, including the school. "My heart sank," remembers Wait. "I was absolutely devastated." But then he got a call from board president and USFS employee Ramiro Rojas, who said the school was still standing. "Some of those embers flying through the air and landing in the middle of town were the size of softballs," marveled Wait. "It's a miracle."

The school building on the north side of Point Road, which houses the library, administration offices and classrooms, has a lot of smoke and ash damage: The building has no air conditioning, so every window was open. Restoration starts this week.

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Tribute to Firefighters

Mandi Jordan Coburn's Creek Fire evacuation story is one that will sound familiar to many on the mountain. Coburn, who owns Ken's Market in Shaver Lake, spent an anxious day on Saturday monitoring the progress of the fire. When the notice to evacuate came, she and her two sons, Jordan and Justin, packed up everything they could—including the store's stock of meat—and skeedaddled down to her home in Shaver Springs.

"I had heard that the fire was pretty roaring, so I decided I'd get some stuff together just in case we had to get out—but I didn't really expect to," Coburn recounted. When the notice came late Sunday morning they had just two hours to evacuate. Once again she packed up important documents, the store inventory that she'd already moved (she left the meat behind this time) and now animals—two German Shepherds and a 'special needs' cat.

By this time vehicles were starting to add up: the store vehicles, her personal vehicles, her sons' vehicles. Multiple trips were made

Dear Editor,

With sincere condolences to everyone that has suffered a loss, I feel compelled to “take pen in hand” and speak out.

Everyone that has dealt with a loved one, or friend, or neighbors, with a drug and/or alcohol problem knows the almost universal initial response is ... denial. Here we face the same syndrome. In the past few weeks how many (pols and non-politicians) have said, to the effect “it is not climate change it is forest mis-management, that is the cause.” Our congressman, Tom McClintock, is “a climate denier.” Why must Republicans believe that? Look no further than the millions contributed to the party and politicians by gas and oil interests. Result, a recent UC study showed that “46% of all Republicans believe that climate change played no part” in the bigger, badder fires.

How can we, all of us, have correct forest management while denying the existence of what must be admitted as at least a factor. I am not saying the “only factor” or even “the largest,” but coupled with the bark beetle infestation and tree death, it is a factor. See Environmental Research Letters, April 29, 2020 by SJ Hart and DI Preston.

The authors used a combination of modeling and firefighter observations (ICS 209 Reports) and in their heavily cited and supported report, conclude that “both daily fire growth and observed the fire behavior were driven by fire weather, not the beetle outbreak, in 56 large wildfire events . . . between 2003 and 2012.” That in these impacted areas “post [beetle] outbreak management strategies should emphasize mitigation of other negative effects on sociological systems, including diminished tourism, tree fall hazard, and the effects on wildlife habitat. [And] in general efforts to reduce the risk of extreme fire behavior should focus on societal adaptation to future warming and extreme weather events.” Namely hotter and drier weather, i.e. Climate Change.

Scientifically there is little or no doubt that such is (at a minimum) a factor in the current larger fires, and, simply has to be dealt with. But believing our current political leaders just hasn’t worked. So what can we do within our existing framework? Start by changing our denier congressman on Nov. 3.

Mandi’s story

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to her parents’ home near Humphrey Station, shuttling cars. “Because there’s no way they’re getting evacuated—they’re 30 minutes from Shaver!”

Monday they started hearing rumblings that the fire might come down through Blue Canyon and on to Humphrey. “So I’m looking at my third evacuation,” she said. “Now the problem with Mom and Dad is they have 30-plus years of stuff at their house, plus multiple livestock and animals, their cars, and a travel trailer.” The evacuation notice came at 2 am Tuesday and the packing began again. “Thank goodness I had the store’s box truck!”

Eventually they landed at her sister’s house in Fresno. With nine people (“we ruined their septic system”), seven dogs (“who didn’t want to be together”), a cat (“hiding under any bed he could find”), and 13 cars (“the neighbors were fantastic”), they spent the next 10-12 days trying not to step on each other and called it the Imromptu 2020 Family Reunion.

“Between all of us we have multiple properties on the hill and they were all spared—it just breaks my heart to think of those who

were affected,” Coburn said.

The tears began to flow freely as she paid this tribute: “That night at my mom and dad’s we went outside and you could see these enormous flames—from that far away!—coming over Pine Ridge and down the grade. And I started to cry because I knew my house was in the way and I started thinking about all that was being lost, and I couldn’t watch any more, even though it was beautiful. I had the scanner on and I could hear where they were trying to fight the fire. I could hear the street names in my neighborhood being called out and I was pretty disheartened. Then I heard one of the engines call out, ‘We need medevac here!’ and dispatch said, ‘I’m so sorry we can’t send medevac right now, it’s too smoky. What is the issue?’ They said, ‘We have a couple of firefighters with burns. We need them off this hill.’ And I just thought to myself, ‘What a noble profession! For them to be protecting our houses. They don’t know us. They’re injuring themselves, they’re going beyond, because this is their calling. So we prayed and I just said, ‘If things burn, let them burn, but protect the people because they can’t be replaced’ ... I don’t know how many times I’ve told this story and I cry every time.”

The Sierra Foundation Steps Up

The Creek Fire that continues to ravage so much of the central Sierra has resulted in an outpouring of support for those affected. In addition to the mountains of supplies, food, water, labor and love, there has been a steady stream of cash and checks being brought to donation centers or simply handed to local individuals and organizations involved in the relief effort. Some funds have been earmarked for individuals. Some have been targeted to specific school districts, usually Big Creek or Pine Ridge. Some of the funds are simply designated for victims of the Creek Fire. As an established local non-profit, The Sierra Foundation stepped up to manage these donations.

The Sierra Foundation is

a 501(c)(3) charitable organization dedicated to supporting the children of the Sierra Unified School District and its feeder districts. The foundation has established a committee to manage the funds designated for victims of what has become the largest single non-complex fire in California history. This group consists of volunteers from Sierra Unified, Big Creek, and Pine Ridge School Districts, Big Sandy and Cold Springs Rancherias, local business donors, and The Sierra Foundation. Any non-targeted funds received by the foundation for the next several months will be set aside for victims of the Creek Fire.

Kids and teachers make connections

Staff was upbeat at the Sept. 28 meeting of the Sierra Unified School District Board, where district superintendent Dr. Alan Harris reported that the goal is for students to be physically back on campus on Oct. 26. SJ/SHS assistant principal Melissa Rodrigues reported that she, along with principal Sean Osterberg, school psychologist Laura Kwong, have met with those students who lost their homes.

Activities director Andrea Marjala reported on the ASB’s successful car wash fundraiser. “We didn’t realize it, but this is the very first school event that the kids have been to since March.” She felt that a lot of healing took place that day.

Teachers and support staff participated in training the previous week, said FES assistant principal Danielle Amundsen, and began meeting in online groups with students, who were excited to connect with each other and share information—like how, where and when they evacuated.

Alternative Ed director Heather Wheeler talked about the prospect of introducing specific tools like breathing and calming techniques that students can use to deal with emotional upset. She also shared the exciting news that Sandy Bluffs Alternate Ed had passed WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) accreditation, good through

2025, giving credit to the staff and former director Ara Keledjian for making it happen. “It’s no easy feat to get a continuation high school accredited,” she noted.

She floated the idea of changing the name of the school to Sierra Alternative High School, to good response from the board. Board member Wes Qualls remarked, “I’m all in. There has been a lingering negative community perception of Sandy Bluffs, and I think the name change would be a good thing.” The proposal will come to the October meeting of the board as a discussion item.

Facilities supervisor Craig Barnes noted that the department’s highest recent priority has been expediting the arrival of two Type I Fire Commands onto the campus. Beginning Sept. 30, the federal portion would relocate to Clovis and the CDF portion to the back of the campus. SCE has established a crew camp at the ag farm with plans to house 1200 staff members there for probably six months. “Our classified staff has done an awesome job over the last three weeks,” Barnes said.

Special Ed program manager Teresa Page elaborated on the teacher trainings, noting that nine separate sessions had included staff from SUSD, Big Creek and Pine Ridge. She mentioned a free app called “Help Kids Cope” that takes adults through how to explain what happens in specific disasters, broken down by the

child’s age. “Anniversaries can be triggers,” she noted. “Trauma will be ongoing.”

The week prior to students returning to campus for academic learning, there will be a “back-to-school” event of sorts to familiarize students with signage, locations, traffic patterns, etc. In other business, protocols for COVID-19 screening for students was discussed. “We will be adjusting as we continue to get advice from the county,” said Harris. The board also passed an emergency resolution to temporarily expedite the time-intensive bidding process for facility repairs. The next regular meeting of the board will be Oct. 19.

In consequence, the SNF will allow roadblock access Oct. 10-11 from 7 am-1 pm



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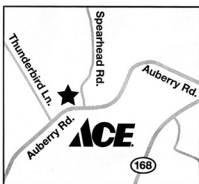

Ice Cold Treats for You!

Mar-Val Market in Prather has been assisting in the distribution of certain donated food items to community members. Often individuals or businesses want to donate food or drink items to the firefighters who are working so hard protecting us from wildfires. Fire crews appreciate the kind gesture but generally cannot accept large amounts of food or drink items from the public. They have all the supplies they need at the Fire Camp or Fire Station, and encourage people to donate these items to individuals and families that were displaced due to the fire, other local service organizations, and members of the community.

"Recently, Wonder Ice Cream Company wanted to donate a whole pallet of individual serving-sized ice creams to the fire fighters," related Mar-Val employee Amanda Dewey. "For one thing, the firefighters couldn't accept this wonderful offer and it takes a lot of space to store that huge amount of ice cream. We have a large freezer at Mar-Val so we offered to store it and distribute it to the community."

Sammy Santillan, assistant manager at Mar-Val, noted that at first the food distribution center for evac-

uated community members at Ace Hardware was issuing vouchers to families to claim a box of ice cream at the store. "Due to the amount we have, while supply lasts, the ice cream treats are being offered to all community members—which includes service personnel, firefighters, or any community member," he said. A small freezer display case has been set up at the exit door of the market where the ice cream can be picked up free. Pepsi Cola Company has also donated a modest supply of soft drinks to the community which are located in coolers next to the ice cream freezer.

Santillan noted, "When the large Munahoo Market gathering was held here on Sept. 19, Producers Dairy donated a cooler truck full of half-gallon plain and chocolate milks to the community. There was still much left after the event and they eventually transferred it to our cooler cases here in the store, where community members could take as much as they wanted for free. We just distributed the last of it on Saturday, Oct. 3."

One thing that Mar-Val is doing to help the community in its recovery after the Creek Fire is coordinating with "Habitat for Humanity." Information is available at the store on how to make donations that will help rebuild the community.

In loving memory of **Deanna Mabelle Bailey**

An outdoor service was held Sept. 25 at the Sacramento Valley National Cemetery for Deanna Mabelle Bailey, who died of natural causes on June 23, just two days before her 79th birthday. She and her late husband, Edward Wylone Bailey, were residents of Auberry from 1978 to 2013.

Born in Bakersfield to Pauline and Clifford Williams, Deanna grew up in the Kern County town of Arvin. There she met Ed, her high school sweetheart and future husband.

The couple married in 1958, and a year later Ed enlisted in the US Air Force. Military life took the young family—which grew to include two daughters and a son—to Petaluma; Colorado Springs, CO; and Torrance. It fostered in Deanna a lifelong knack for adjusting to different circumstances and discovering the best in each new place.

While in Colorado Springs, she worked at the famed Broadmoor Hotel and gathered tales of the hotel's well-to-do and sometimes eccentric guests.

After Ed left the military in 1966 to pursue a career in teaching, the family lived in Bakersfield, Fresno and Camarillo. Deanna worked in

the grocery industry and later as an optometric assistant in Fresno and Auberry. She became active in the Central California Optometric Assistants Society.

In 1978, the family moved to Tollhouse and then to Auberry. Deanna helped chaperone weekend field trips for Ed's high school students and frequently opened their home to students who were staying after school for sports, dances and other activities. She and Ed also became active participants in the Coarsegold Gold Prospectors.

In midlife, Deanna became interested in her Native American heritage and began learning more about the history of the Cherokee

Nation through the Cherokees of Northern Central Valley and the Cherokee National Historical Society.

She had an insatiable love for reading as well as a keen interest in other countries and cultures. She did not hesitate to travel by herself, visiting Hawaii, Mexico, Ireland, Poland and Russia.

Long adept at embroidery, crocheting, and quilting, Deanna became active in the Sierra Oaks Senior and Community Center's quilting group, developing close friendships and making many quilts and quilt blocks.

In 2013, with Ed's health declining, the Baileys moved to Woodland to be near their son and his family. After Ed's death in 2018, Deanna became a volunteer at the Woodland Community and Senior Center, continued quilting and enjoyed gaming at the nearby Cache Creek Casino.

She will be remembered for her kind heart, sparkling blue eyes and refusal to be overcome by life's most daunting circumstances.

She leaves her daughter, Wylona Farrens and her husband Albert of Paso Robles; son, Andan Bailey (Pat) of Davis; nine grandchildren; and nine great-grandchildren. She also leaves sisters-in-law Cheryl Bailey of Payson, AZ and Raylene Williams of Lodi; and cousin-in-law Gerald McNeill of Bakersfield. In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by her parents; daughter, Samantha; and brother Dwight Williams.

On the south side, the damage was more extensive. "The pool is a mess," said Wait. "All of the electric has to be replaced and the pool redone." They'd just filled two propane tanks, a thousand gallons each. When they blew (one flew 30 yards and ripped in half), the windows in the cafeteria were blown out and glass went everywhere. Although the building is structurally sound, it needs "a ton of work," said Wait.

Big Creek School students went back to distance learning on Sept. 14, the Monday after the first full week of the fire. "They wanted to get back," says Wait. His wife, Stephanie, is a teacher. "She was in the back seat of our car doing a Zoom meeting one day." That first week was spent working through social and emotional issues and establishing a routine, but no time was wasted getting back into core academics the following week. "We've been out of school since March. Our students can't afford these huge delays." Small schools have more flexibility, he noted.

The school had been granted a waiver by the county and had planned to have students back on campus after Labor Day. Post-fire, Wait still wants kids back on campus; with county approval, possibly by late October or early November. He worries about mudslides on the roads buses will travel but notes they will be constantly monitored. On the plus side,

thanks to the tireless efforts of BCS employee Carson Brockway and SCE employees, the town now has water and should have power this week.

Ultimately, just one of Southern California Edison's 34 "company houses" (there are also 10 SCE apartments) was lost and one damaged, but 41 of the other 58 houses in town were destroyed, including Wait's and four of six school houses. Along with displaced students, several school employees will need to find housing. Where, he doesn't know. "That's going to be a challenge." He estimates about 40 of the school's 55 students have Edison connections. In addition to Big Creek, the school also serves students in Huntington and Shaver.

As far as rebuilding, "I think everyone who lost a house certainly wants to be back there. But there are a lot of considerations, including economic," said Wait. "It's still raw right now to make that decision."

He continued, "This community is our little slice of paradise. Coming up from Fresno when I would get to Cressman's, my blood pressure would drop. Fresh air!"

Things are different now. But, Wait says, "We'll make new memories."

Louise Frazier Finrock of Prather, CA, passed away on Saturday, Sept. 26, 2020, at home with her devoted husband of 42 years, Larry, by her side. Louise was born on November 21, 1941 in Orange County to Frank and Ruth Frazier.

Fire. At the event, representatives of the Historical Society and the Fund explained their shared values of restoration, community and stewardship.

CSHS board president Keith Swinger welcomed those in attendance and thanked all those who “performed miracles” in the battle with the Creek Fire.

“We’re able to be here at this spot because of the healthy forest management practices employed in the Edison Forest,” said Swinger. SCE forester John Mount, now retired, was the driving force behind those management practices, including selective thinning of trees and controlled burns.

Mount introduced a succession of speakers, at times becoming visibly emotional as he spoke about his beloved forest. More than once he referenced how the city of Montecito in Santa Barbara County bounced back from the devastating 1964 Coyote Fire, only to get in the way of the Thomas Fire just over 50 years later, with ensuing mudflows that killed a confirmed 21 people. “We’re not interested in bouncing back,”

he said, “we’re interested in long-term survivability.”

It was a theme emphasized by forester Juli Stewart, who remarked that the longterm goal of community and agency partnerships is to rebuild the forest in “a fire-resilient manner so people don’t have to live in fear of another fire coming through in five, 10 or 50 years.”

Ty Gillette, who had owned historic Cressman’s General Store for just over a year when it burned, commented on the hope, strength and energy he sees in the community, and stressed the need to “see some momentum” in recovery.

Jacqueline McDonald Pucheu suggested that with the loss of Shaver Ranch, her family’s traditional stewardship role “hasn’t come to an end, but maybe has just begun.”

Mount praised Fresno County for being “way ahead of the curve” in its response to the bark beetle infestation and for continuing its proactive stance in the current crisis. As a symbol of hope, he gestured toward the trees surrounding the amphitheater, pointing out that they were not here 100 years ago, as that area had been clear-cut by loggers. He recog-

nized the Sierra and Ridge Top 4H members in attendance—some of whom had lost their homes in the fire—who would be planting seedlings in burned areas that very afternoon. “I’ve planted hundreds of thousands of trees,” he said. “There’s nothing more satisfying than seeing a new forest born.”

Afterward, informational stops were made at Sierra Marina Vista, Shaver Ranch and Cressman’s. “We’re absolutely rebuilding Shaver Ranch!” said Steve McDonald, great-grandson of pioneering lumberman C.B. Shaver, for whom Shaver Lake was named. His wife, Michelle, commented, “We did everything we could [to reduce fire hazards].” They had cleared the 400-acre property of bug-killed trees and were in the process of re-foresting in 20-acre increments, having just planted 3,200 new trees when the fire raged through. “The meadow is still green,” she pointed out hopefully.

The forest is my office

Local Licensed Timber Operator Ryan Day enjoys going out into the forest to do his job and considers the forest to be his office. “I like being in the mountains—in my office—but today I would prefer to be in my office under nicer circumstances,” he said.

Day is a local boy and attended Sierra High School. When asked why he decided to go into the timber business, he commented that he’d always been interested in working in the forest, plus he had a couple of uncles who live in Grass Valley in the timber business. “I guess I got the desire from them.”

In 2006 he started “Lite On The Land” with one piece of equipment—a skid steer—and worked around the mountains for various homeowners creating fire clearance and fuel reduction. He became an LTO in 2013; a year later, Lite On The Land became a full-time logging company and is now a contractor for Sierra Forest Products and PG&E and SCE. “We continue to grow as we gain experience,” Day said. “We are dedicated to the health and sustainability

of our forests while maintaining traditional forestry practices and integrating up-to-date techniques.”

During the Creek Fire, they cut trees in Big Creek for Southern California Edison, and are now cutting on the old railroad grade that runs from Big Creek Road to Italian Bar Road. This dirt roadway is an important tributary, taking personnel to Chawanakee and hosting transmission and distribution lines. In its current condition it isn’t safe to travel, due to the possibility of trees falling on the roadway.

“So far we’ve traveled about three miles since Sept. 21,” he stated, “cutting 1,500 trees as we go and moving them from the roadway.”

Members of Day’s crew of 15 are also working on Mount Stevenson for Edison, doing salvage logging. Their first call-out after the fire started was to Dinkey Creek Road. The work is very hard on the crew and they do take days off to rest; however, foreman Cody Parker has not taken a day in a month.

Day says the forest “will never be the same in my lifetime. It’s sad that fuel reduction needs to be done to help preserve what is left.”

Busy from Day One

Tim Messer, a Licensed Timber Operator (LTO), is the owner-operator of Messer Construction and Logging and has been serving Central California for decades.

Messer was born here and has lived here all of his life. His father owned and operated a sawmill at Tule Meadow in Wishon while he was growing up, and he worked there in the summer before the snows came to close them for the winter.

By 1980 the mill was closed and the business became logging; his father incorporated and gave him 45 percent of the business. “We worked on homestead land, and felled timber on the Sample family’s land for 15 years,” he stated.

His past logging experience put him and his crew on the front lines the first night of the Creek Fire. His crew was called out by Cal Fire and began their work cutting fire lines at Comstock Road and Big Sandy Rancheria with five men falling trees, which were pushed aside with a bulldozer out of the fire’s path. (Trees that are felled on private property belong to the landowner and they are responsible for removing them or using them as they see fit.)

After the fire passed through, the burned areas were full of dangerous trees that were either falling or posed a threat of falling and had to be taken down. His crew of 15 men felled burned and dead trees on Peterson

Road; from Peterson to four corners; and the top of the four-lanes to the Big Creek turn-off.

His crew has been working non-stop falling some 300 to 350 trees a day, and have had no days off since the fire began on Sept. 4. “The Creek Fire is a large magnitude fire and has required considerable effort,” he said.

When asked for his thoughts on whether the government would do anything about timber harvest to reduce the overgrowth in the California forest, his response was, “They’ll talk about it for awhile and then the idea will fizzle away as it always has in years past.” The state has minimal timber land; most of the forest belongs to the federal government.

He followed up by saying that if the powers that be would spend half the amount of money on prevention as they do on suppression, they would save a lot of money and make the forest healthier. “Fires are big business,” he said, what with camps being set up, food vendors, and other necessities making “big money.”

Messer gave a shout-out to Jim McDougald as the driving force in getting roads open so that logging trucks could get on and off the hill to deliver logs to the Terra Bella Mill in Tulare.

After years in the woods, Messer says he has no intentions of retiring anytime soon. He says, “I enjoy my work and I like being out with the guys.”

CCADT creates safe space

As the Creek Fire unfolded, thousands of pets and livestock accompanied owners in a mass exodus off the mountain, but the Central California Animal Disaster Team (CCADT) was up for the challenge. They provided shelter and care for over 600 furry, feathered, and sometimes scaly fire evacuees. Prather resident Jeannie Sa, Resource Program Director and Shelter Manager with CCADT, shared some insight into what it was like behind the scenes.

In the first days of the disaster, animals were directed to a location in Oakhurst. When that reached capacity, another site was set up in Coarsegold. As the threat continued, a shelter was added at Granite Ridge Intermediate. At first, the pace of animal intake was fairly steady, but the swiftly-evolving nature of evacuation orders resulted in a supersized wave of displacement. Another shelter was set up at the Fresno Fairgrounds.

"We got slammed," Sa noted. The flow of people and their animals awaiting intake "was continual for two days." She worked for 36 hours and was helped during that time by three college-aged volunteers. The urgency of the situation was relayed via text, email and social media, and Sa was heartened by the way the community and other organizations worked together.

Fresno Humane Animal Services, veterinary care centers, the Red Cross, and volunteers stepped into action. Carriers and supplies were donated, along with food and other essentials to ensure that the animals in this makeshift "Noah's Ark" were made comfortable and safe. Volunteers were also recruited to clean up and care for the animals, which sometimes involved walking the dogs. Sa light-heartedly recounted advising some of the volunteers regarding many mountain canines. She

admonished them to be patient, as they might never have been restrained by a leash, or taken an intentional walk. After their stay, Sa reported that many canines did well—and learned some manners.

Sa did "a lot of listening" as many of her mountain friends and neighbors shared stories of displacement, separation and loss. She noted that during a disaster people gain comfort knowing that their animals are in a safe place and that they can spend time with them. Tollhouse resident Amanda McMeen, along with parents Terri and Larry McMeen, sister Becky Zagha and niece Talya, utilized the CCADT to provide shelter for three dogs, five cats, and 10 chickens. McMeen said it was a comfort to know that the animals were being well cared for, the volunteers were kind and helpful, and she didn't have to worry about her pets going missing.

Sa has always had a love for animals, and after the Goose Fire of 2016 put this passion into action by joining CCADT. Though the organization has been involved in other fire incidents since her membership, the sheer magnitude of the Creek Fire and the havoc that it wreaked will not be forgotten. Volunteers are always appreciated.

Sa has become inspired to help others in a deeper way. In the early 2000s, she was attending college and majoring in psychology. She'd like to return to earn her degree, and hopes to specialize in helping victims of disaster trauma. While working with animal evacuees, Sa's family received the order to evacuate, and her horse Rainy was sheltered near her. Amid the coordinated chaos and long work hours, Sa did not have the opportunity visit him, though son Rory faithfully did. Since Sa has been able to remain home longer, she reports that Rainy is giving her "the cold shoulder," but after giving him a few of his favorite snacks he will soon be warming up to her.

Ash-sifters built for fire victims

"Our homes contain pieces of our life stories," says Vicki Clason who, with her husband Mike, has created a project to construct ash-sifting boxes. After learning that many people lost their homes from the devastating Creek Fire, the Clasons wanted to do something to help.

"I remember reading about people literally sifting through the ashes of their homes after the Camp Fire in Paradise, California. They sometimes found small things the fire left behind — jewelry, pieces of pottery, utensils and other bits and pieces of their lives." Clason did some research and found a news report video showing how a high school class made boxes to aid in the sifting process. "My husband watched the news clip and figured out how to con-

struct the boxes."

Clason learned more about the sifting process by interviewing a Camp Fire survivor and from that information decided to make sturdy but lightweight boxes. The boxes are sized to fit in the top part of a wheelbarrow. Sifted ash falls into the wheelbarrow and then the ash is hauled away. Some people prefer to place the boxes over sawhorses and place a five-gallon bucket underneath to collect the ash.

"My husband has been absolutely wonderful to get this project going," says Clason. "He has the wood cut and ready so when family, friends, or members of our church come to help, all we have to do is assemble the boxes. We've gotten a lot of help from people of all ages and skill levels!" After the boxes are constructed, volunteers are encouraged

to write notes of encouragement on the outside frames.

The Clasons have donated their boxes to the Red Cross and plan to make them available through other local distribution locations as well. Anyone in the community who needs ash-sifting boxes can contact the Clasons by leaving a voice message at (559) 288-6505.

crime,” she said.

As Magsig introduced Fire Chief Mark Johnson, he commented, “As a supervisor I can feel helpless sometimes. But I saw my role in this as providing information to you, and without Chief Johnson I wouldn’t have had that access.”

Johnson noted that fuels work done in the last six years had a huge role in what was saved, including the fuel break in West Shaver and other breaks. If residents see smokes in the months ahead and call them in, understand that if spot fires are not near structures, they might be allowed to just burn out.

Kevin with USFS noted that there were still nearly 2,000 people working on the fire. Bulldozers and excavators were working to make sure that the situation wasn’t made worse in the aftermath by erosion and mudslides.

County administrative officer Jean Rousseau shared information about the county’s response. Over 4,500 animals were evacuated and at the peak of the event, about 2,600 people (600 families) were sheltered.

“We’ve looked at other fires where years later people are still trying to rebuild,” said Magsig. “We’re learning from their mistakes and trying accelerate bringing normalcy back.”

PG&E’s Erica Guerrero noted that the steep hills that challenge firefighters also challenge PG&E crews. Poles in areas inaccessible by heavy equipment have to be set by hand. PG&E has identified 23,568 hazard trees; 9,889 have been removed.

SCE’s Brian Thoburn reported that power in Big Creek was expected to be restored by the weekend, Huntington was being assessed, and power in most of Shaver had been restored using gen-

erators. Hydro facilities were resuming limited operations.

Marco Sanchez with CalTrans reported that hazard trees along roadways should be removed up to Tamarack Ridge by the following Thursday and most of the guardrail had been replaced.

Dave Pomaville, director of Fresno County Dept. of Public Health, said the county hopes to be able to free up grant money set aside for public infrastructure for use on private property. Data is being gathered as they try to “make the case that the collective impact is worthy of state and federal assistance.”

Will Kettler of Public Works and Planning addressed rebuilding plans and permitting. “We’ll do our best to offer expedited services,” he promised, including pursuing an emergency ordinance to allow temporary structures on-site such as RVs and tiny homes.

Questions from the audience included concerns about the condition of roads, capping water meters in Big Creek, and restocking resources for the Big Creek VFD. One person questioned the factors taken into consideration in determining the health of trees marked for removal. Magsig promised that county staff would work with landowners to get felled trees off their property. Questioned whether homeowners initiating clean-up without waiting for approval would preclude assistance from FEMA, Pomaville said, “We would advocate for you as best we can,” but noted that where federal assistance has been provided on other fires, they have bypassed properties where clean-up has been initiated.

When there’s a need Red Cross is there

In a bright red vest, standing at the side of the road and waving to passersby, volunteer Sina Davis from Des Moines, Iowa, drew attention to the Red Cross disaster relief station set up near the Shaver Lake Volunteer Fire Department in the town of Shaver on Friday, Oct. 2.

Bald Mountain resident Larry Coulter, who was on his way to Shaver Lake Hardware, couldn’t resist stopping by to see what was inside the white five-gallon plastic buckets emblazoned with the familiar Red Cross symbol that Davis and volunteer Chris Austin were seeking to distribute. Coulter was one of about 30 locals who pulled over that day.

Inside the free fire-kits were masks, gloves, brushes and cleaning supplies. The distribution site also has tools—including shovels and rakes—and snacks!

This is Davis’ first deployment with the Red Cross. Davis quit her corporate job after finding it no longer fulfilling and immediately signed on with the Red Cross. She signed up Sept. 14 and was deployed to the Creek Fire on Sept. 20.

Austin, who is retired and lives on one of South Caro-

lina’s barrier islands, is in his fourth year with the Red Cross, having been deployed previously to disasters in Mississippi and New Orleans, among others. “The emergency stage is short-term,” he commented. “It’s the recovery stage that takes the longest.” Their assignment for this particular incident is bulk distribution, not sheltering. “But being flexible

volunteers, we could be sent anywhere at any time.” The volunteers are supplied with room and board, but receive no other compensation.

Davis was excited that locals were spreading the word on social media. The next day, based on local feedback, another relief station was set up at Cressman’s. Come on by and check it out! They are eager to be of service.
